Our sixth graders are building up their vocabulary and grammar with our Wordly Wise and Shurley


workbooks in English. During their journal writing, they write about a variety of topics, some of which they choose on their own. Writing about any topic at length will aid all of them, but especially those who will be testing for bigger schools in the fall.

Students in seventh grade English are enthralled by this quarter's class novel, The Outsiders, and are excited to move on to their next reading assignment. They have also just completed their first Wordly Wise test for this quarter and are getting to know their new Shurley program. This week's focus is capitalization rules!

**Sixth grade social studies** students have jumped into middle school and their World History class and have made a big splash in the process. They have already learned two styles of note-taking! In class, they are learning about early huntergatherer societies, and the importance of fire to early man.

Seventh grade social studies students are learning about world geography. Although it can be somewhat tedious, our seventh graders have taken it in stride and have performed very well on their first

> quiz. Right now, they are learning about the physical features and early people of the United States and are using outlines to write down all the information they learned from our textbooks and during lectures.

characteristics and states of matter.

**Seventh grade math** students are adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing decimals and integers. We are also evaluating expressions with the order of operations and the distributive property.

Students in eighth grade algebra are reviewing functions and patterns, scatter plots and other ways of displaying data, and how to find the mean, median, mode, and range of sets of data.

#### Mrs. Schroppel's News:


Seventh grade is off to a great start! The students are really stepping up to the responsibility of being chapel buddies with the first graders, and are looking forward to doing activities together and going swimming with them. In Bible we are learning about God and His Word. The focus for our year is Galatians 5:22-23 ~ "...the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self control..."

Sixth grade math has reviewed place value, exponents and estimation and is beginning number sense. Seventh and eighth prealgebra students are learning the language of algebra as they study algebraic expressions and integers. The first test is coming up!

The eighth grade English class is getting reacquainted with Shurley, while jumping right into journal

> writing, vocabulary (Wordly Wise), and literature. We are reading the voung adult

book, *Uglies*, which is about a utopian society where everyone gets to become "pretty" on their 16th birthday. Should be interesting!
