
Arban followed her students down the aisle with jump rope twirling hand. What a blast! Please help your child raise money for The American Heart Association through the Jump Rope

Classroom News - Junior High

Mrs. Hantel's News:

Sixth grade Bible students need to be sure to tune in to SMLS-6 news as they complete their news reports on the Elijah-Baal showdown. Each student will play the part of either anchor-person, reporter, or prophet and will report on the fiery competition between the prophet Elijah and 400+ prophets of Baal.

Sixth grade science students are rockin' out with their new unit in Earth Science. The students are learning about weathering and erosion of the earth's surface. Feel free to ask the students how antacid tablets demonstrate the different rates of weathering.

Seventh grade science students are immersing themselves in the parts of the Bible that remind us that we are created by a loving and devoted Father. The students are learning about the theories that exist on this topic, and comparing them to the words of our God.
