

## Classroom News - Junior High

#### Mrs. Hantel's News:

In physical science **eighth graders** have spent some time being introduced to the study of physics and chemistry. They are currently learning about the different characteristics of matter, how it is measured and the different changes matter can undergo.

The **seventh graders** in pre-algebra have just finished the first chapter in their textbook. They have spent the first few weeks of class reviewing some of the important concepts they have learned in the previous few years. In the next chapter, they will be introduced to solving one-step equations and inequalities.

The **Eighth graders** in algebra have just finished the first chapter in their textbook. They have spent the first few weeks of class reviewing some of the important algebraic concepts they have learned the past few years. In the next chapter, the 8th graders will be working on solving problems using rational numbers

**Sixth grade** Bible students are beginning their journey through the Old Testament, which includes a lot of beginnings. So far, they have witnessed the creation of the world in seven days. They also met Adam and Eve and discovered the first sin. The 6<sup>th</sup> graders spent some time getting to know a little bit about Noah and his ark, and Abraham. Most recently, they have traveled to Canaan and Egypt to meet Joseph and his jealous brothers.

Earth science **sixth graders** have had a little introduction into the study of earth science. They are currently learning about different types of maps/globes and how they are used to study the earth's surface.

**Seventh grade** life science Students have had a little introduction into the study of life science. They have spent some time learning about the different characteristics of life. The 7<sup>th</sup> graders are currently learning about the different parts and organelles of a cell. We look forward to seeing their first projects next week of cell diagrams. Some of these diagrams may be tasty!!

#### **Miss Maddick's News:**

The junior high is starting the year by jumping in with both feet into the mysteries that literature, the Bible, and history have for us.

In language arts/English we are hard at work with vocabulary, spelling, grammar, writing, AR reading, and class novels. **Sixth grade** is exploring the mysterious world in *Tuck Everlasting*, **seventh grade** is fishing in the Cuban sea with *The Old Man and the Sea*, and **eighth grade** is off on an epic adventure with *The Odyssey*.

In **seventh grade** Bible class, we began with an overview of what *Luther's Small Catechism* is, and why we will be using it all year. We are now taking a closer look at the 10 Commandments.

In **eighth grade** Bible class, we are examining our lives as Christians. We are also starting small group Bible studies to study books of the Bible more closely.

In **social studies**, we are looking at the beginnings of history, when man moved beyond oral history and began recording events. We are working on our map skills to aid this worldwide journey. As we investigate these mysteries, we look forward to the clues and possibilities to come.
