Classroom News - Third & Fourth Grade

Third Grade: December is a fun time for third grade. We started off jumping into multiplication and finishing up a unit on graphs. In language arts, we are busy writing captivating paragraphs and learning how to edit them. By the end of the quarter, we will have learned all of our lower and uppercase cursive letters. Currently a science experiment is in the observation stage as we keep making predictions on what is happening. In art this month we will be creating a special painting for Christmas.

Fourth Grade: The fourth grade class has had a busy month! First,

they are working on a research project on the plants and animals we

have here in Hawai'i. Each student did research on a plant or animal and are now busy creating a PowerPoint to showcase all the facts they

learned. Second, we went on an amazing learning trip to Hanauma Bay. The students learned more about the sea creatures we have in our ocean and got to see them up close and personal when we went

snorkeling. Third, we got to go on another learning trip to Bishop Mu-

seum. We experienced three presentations showing how the first settlers to Hawai'i used the stars to get here. We also learned the life stages of a volcanic island, and the dif-

ferent materials Hawaiians used to make the things they needed to live and survive. I'm sure their fourth grade brains are now jam-packed with all the knowledge they gained this month!

Classroom News - Fifth Grade

Fifth Grade: Fifth grade has been learning what life was like during the colonial days. They have studied the New England, Middle, and Southern Colonies. We visited Honolulu Museum of Art and dressed-up in colonial outfits, carded wool, did weaving on a loom, and went inside a reconstructed colonial house. It was a wonderful and educational experience for the class.

The following week, we continued

to do various activities that were common during the 1600's. We made butter, wrote with quill pens, sewed buttons on material, and did limner portraits which were typical during that period.



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Classroom News - Middle School

Mrs. Brooks' News:

In **sixth grade Bible** students are preparing scripts and will be performing their skits on one of the parables in the Gospel.

Eighth grade algebra students are working on story problems and converting words into algebraic equations. They came up with their own stories for their classmates to solve. We are now solving inequalities.

Seventh grade science students learned about Gregor Mendel and how traits are passed down through genes. We made our own pets with certain traits and crossed them to find out what characteristics the offspring would exhibit.

Seventh grade math students worked on one and two-step equations and solving them for a variable. Then we'll move on to solving and graphing inequalities in the upcoming days.

Eighth grade science students are learning how atoms bond to form molecules. They are characterizing the differences between ionic and covalent bonds and did a lab using candy pieces to represent electrons. Ask your student how **Mrs. Brooks** related covalent bonds to the basketball court!!

And **Sixth grade science** students investigated the Earth and what it is made of from the crust down to the inner core. They were able to use their creativity to write a story about their journey to the center of the Earth – combining their fictional story with the science of what we are learning.


